Vaccinations

I was very pleased to discover, this week, that the percentage of 12-15 year olds vaccinated for COVID at ICC is more than double that of the percentage across Oxfordshire. As I said in last week's newsletter, I hope this brings us some school herd immunity after the half term break.

Remote Learning for Students with COVID

I would really like to ask for empathy and understanding here. As parents, you were overwhelmingly supportive of our remote provision during the lockdown in the earlier part of this year, not least for the fact that our students received almost 25 hours (other than core PE, etc) of high quality learning via Teams each week.

During this time, staff were teaching in front of their laptop, focusing exclusively on students who had joined their call. This was not an easy task, a brand new challenge for the teaching profession, yet one to which I think ICC colleagues rose admirably.

At the latter part of last year, when we had a small number of COVID cases, we still had transition points between every lesson which meant that staff were able to "hook" students in to Teams calls before students arrived to their "real" rather than "virtual" classrooms.

As you will know, there have been a higher number of COVID cases this term, and staff are regularly emailed to inform them when students have received a positive PCR test. Please bear in mind, in the first instance, that, when staff are teaching all day, they don't always get a chance to read their emails until the end of the school day. This means that they aren't able to invite students to calls until, at least, the next day. They no longer have transition points which means that they have no time between lessons to call students to calls – their focus is on dismissing 30 children and welcoming 30 more children into their next lesson (this requires a certain level of skill and attention several times a day!). This will, inevitably, sometimes result in staff calling students a little later to join their lessons.

Staff are also now, rightly, circulating around their rooms, to help students in their classes, as well as diagnosing what they can and can't do. They are no longer sitting at their desks talking into their laptops. Inevitably, this results in issues with sound quality, etc, for the child who has joined the Teams call at home.

Whilst we are doing our very best to provide remote learning to students who have COVID and, most unfortunately, have to stay at home, please be mindful that they are usually 1 child out of 30 and the other 29 really do require the majority of the teacher's attention!!

Information has been sent out to parents of students in Year 10 (on Monday) and Year 7 (today). Please do check your junk/spam folders if you haven't received this as it can, occasionally, find itself there!

Year 11 Personalised Revision Guidance

As parents, you should also have received personalised revision guidance for your child leading up to the Year 11 Mock Exams in December. This is also emailed to all Year 11 students directly. Again, please do check your junk/spam folders for this if you are yet to see it.

Revision Guidance 1 came out on Friday 8 October, with 2 and 3 coming out on Friday 15 October and today respectively. Your child will know that they will get their 4th set of revision on Friday 29 October during half term. Please do make sure that they are looking out for this one too!

I hope you all have a restful and enjoyable half term.

Year 8 Subject Focus Day: Madame Tussaud's Trip



Half term opportunity to meet Alice in Wonderland!




