Monday lunchtimes, Room 16

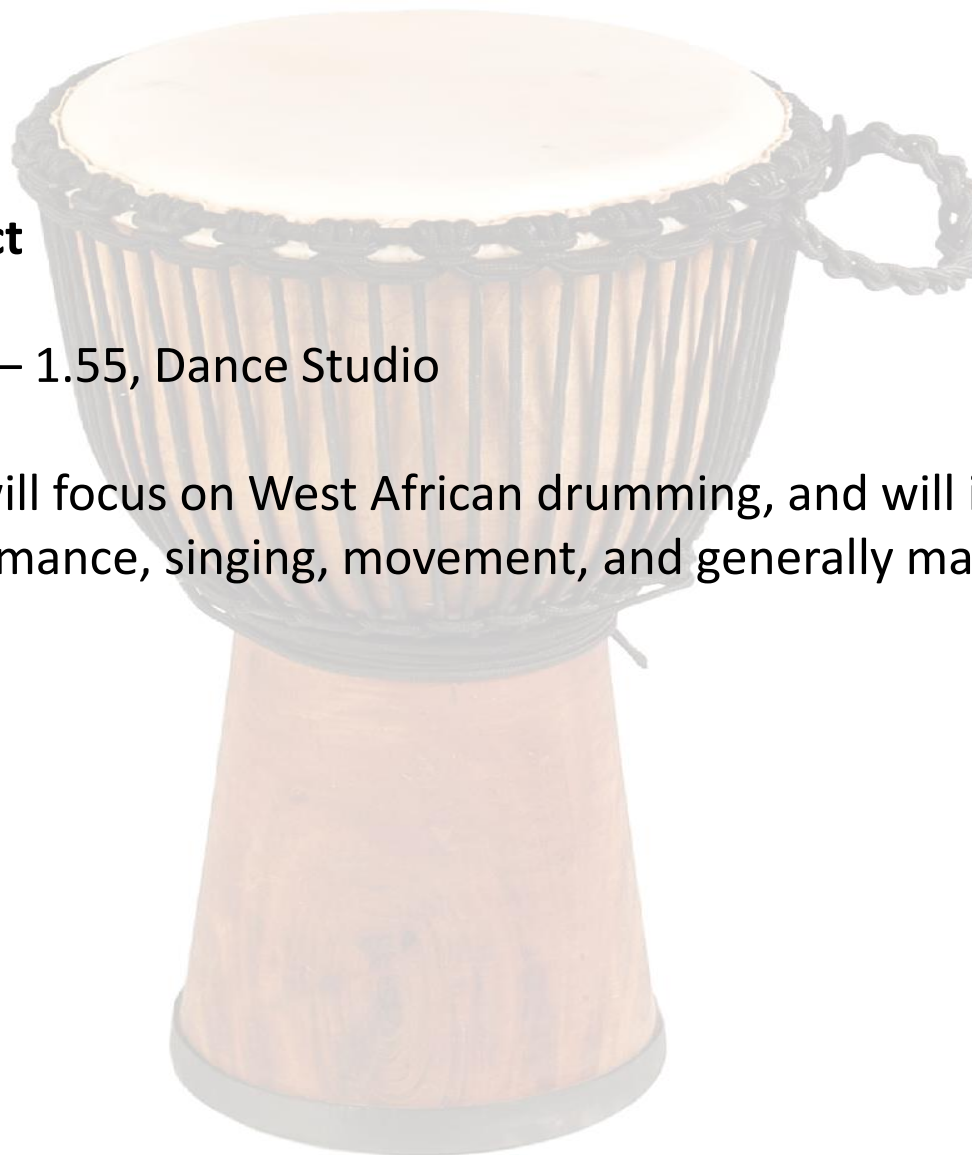
Learn how to plan and deliver a speech to engage your audience. Compete against other teams to see who can produce the best speeches.
